58 Years of glorious existence

Intellectuals and social reformers realized the need to establish a college in the West-Nalbari region, taking into account the growing need for higher education in Chamata and its neighbouring regions. Prominent politicians, educators, and social workers such as Late Pramod Ch. Barman, Late Bishwa Goswami, Late Srikanta Dutta, and others made significant contributions to the establishment of this college.

The local community of Chamata and Belsor provided a great deal of assistance and support for the establishment of Kamrup College on July 25, 1966. At first, the institution hosted nighttime classes in the premises of Chamata Higher Secondary School. In 1968, the college moved to its current campus. Beginning with 7 students, the college eventually was able to fetch 90 students with the assistance of Nalbari College right after. There are presently about 1700 students, and the number is steadily increasing. The college had no principal when it originally opened and was taught by Late Chandra Talukdar along with three other academics. Subsequently, after retiring as the head of the Assamese depar-

tment at Cotton College, Late Chandra Kanta Mahanta joined as principal. Degree programs began in 1969 and were approved by UGC in 1971. Additionally, the college received UGC grant-in-aid status in 1975.

At present the college is a provincialised college of the Government of Assam and recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC) and has 12(B) and 2(f) status. The college is affiliated to the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) at the Higher Secondary level and to the Gauhati University at the undergraduate level. The college has been accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) two times; first in 2005, with B+ grade (institutional score 78%) and second in 2016, with "A" grade (CGPA 3.04). While the college had only Arts Stream in earlier academic sessions, the Government of Assam granted Science Stream in the year 2022, which has been running since. The Open and Distance Learning (ODL) wing of the college serves as a recognized study center of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University.

Kamrup College, Chamata envisions both academic and professional excellence. With proper consideration for human values, the college is committed to provide an abundance of opportunities to students to develop their interpersonal and leadership abilities in this setting. COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE & FACILITIES



Hostel

The college has hostel facility for girls. The number of seats currently available in the Girl's Hostel is 30. Application form for hostel admission may be collected from the office of the college and submitted to the concerned office assistant after getting admission in the college.

Canteen

The college canteen provides refreshment to students at subsidized rates within the college premises. The canteen has a television set for use by students only.

Auditorium

The college auditorium, called the Community Hall, can host 300 audience members at once.

Conference Hall & Digital Classroom

The state-of-the-art conference hall is equipped with all the latest technology for offline / online meetings and conferences. It can also function as a digital classroom when required.

Laboratory Facility

The department of English hosts a sophisticated language lab and the department of Education runs a psychological lab. The department of History maintains a historical archive of their own. A computational lab serves the needs of the departments of Mathematics and Physics. All the departments of the science stream are equipped with lab facilities for practical and hands-on classes.

Student Recreation Centre

There are student recreation centres for boys and girls with all recreational facilities.

Gymnasium and Sports Facilities

The college has an well-equipped gymnasium, a basketball court and an open field for games and sports.



COURSES OFFERED

The college offers courses of study in Arts and Science up to undergraduate level as Regular & Honours programs under Gauhati University. The courses will be according to the National Education Policy-2020 as implemented by Gauhati University. The Higher Secondary section offers 10+2 level course in Arts stream under the ambit of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. Though the medium of instruction is generally Assamese, in certain case, English is retained as complementary to Assamese. The medium of instruction for courses in the science stream is purely English.

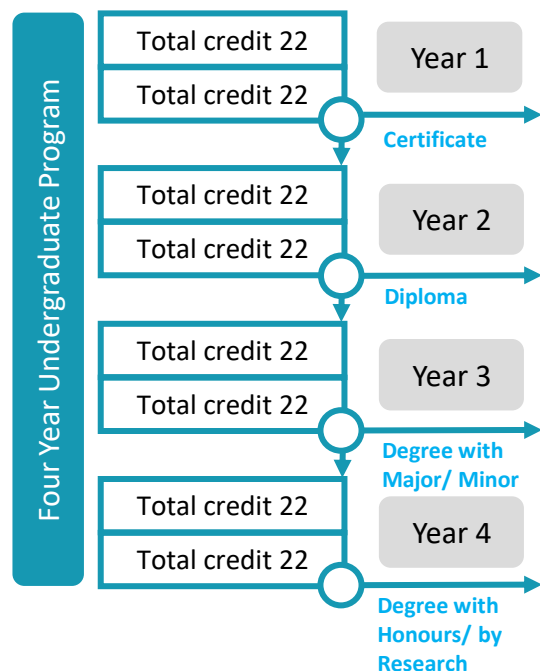

Note: The department of English offers classes on soft skills and personality development. Students have to appear for a compulsory Environmental Studies paper in the class 11 final examination.

Undergraduate Course Structure

The Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) will be according to the guidelines prepared by Gauhati University as per National Education Policy 2020.

As per the NEP Guidelines of Gauhati University, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if one completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours). This will be implemented



Credit Structure

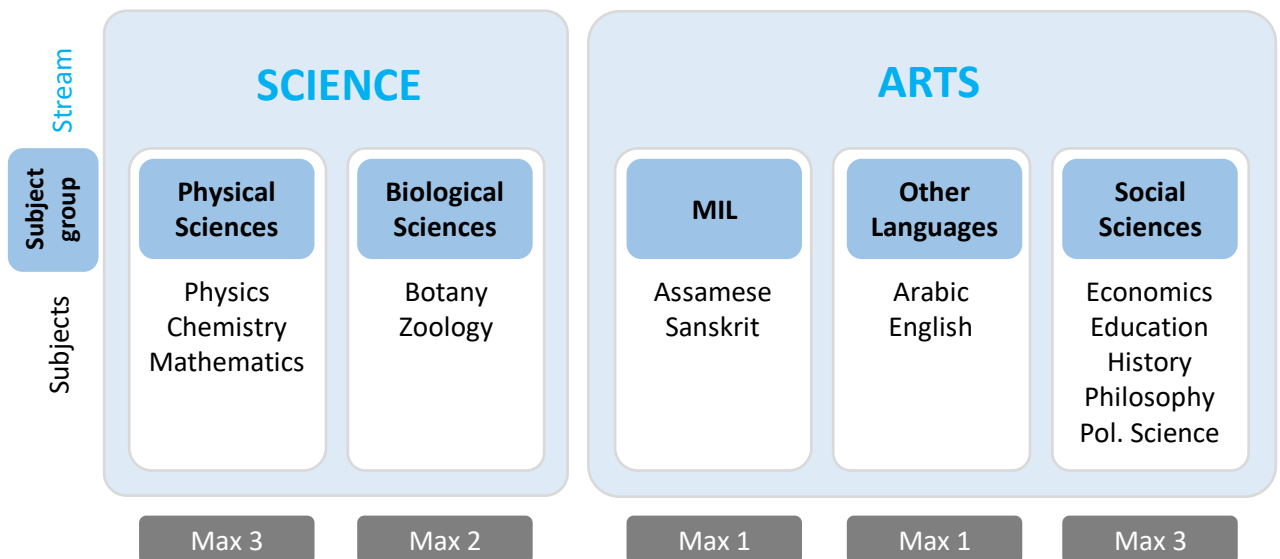
The FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements becomes 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively.

The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. The total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects. Updated credit structure shall be available at the Gauhati University website.

Major/Minor Subjects

The college offers “[Bachelor’s Degree in a Stream](#)” as per the FYUGP of Gauhati University. The streams available at the college are Arts and Science. The following subject groups and subjects are available:



Note:

- Mathematics and Economics are Dual-stream subjects.
- Major and Minor courses are available for all subjects.
- Each of these groups has their own constraints as to up to how many number of subjects from each subject-group can be chosen by a student. This is indicated in the previous figure with the word Max.
- A student can choose any three subjects from the subject groups Arts and Science.
- The ability to take a subject from a particular group will depend on prerequisites (qualifications that a student must have) and Group Constraints. More details will be informed to the students in due course of time. It is advised to check the portal at nep.gauhati.ac.in for the latest updates.
- All subjects have at least one paper compulsory in all semesters.

Multidisciplinary Courses

The multidisciplinary subjects are Class XII-standard subjects. The entire multidisciplinary group is divided into six categories. All these categories will have three papers each, to be studied during Semesters 1-3. The college shall offer three multidisciplinary categories:

Natural Science:

1. Introduction to Natural and Physical Sciences
2. Natural and Physical Sciences in Everyday Life
3. Applications and Prospects of Natural and Physical Sciences

Mathematical Science:

1. Foundations of Mathematical Sciences I
2. Foundations of Mathematical Sciences II
3. Foundations of Mathematical Sciences III

Humanities & Social Science:

1. Makers of Modern Assam
2. Democracy and People's Rights
3. Understanding Globalization

Skill Courses

A student can take any skill course offered by the college during Semesters 1-3. The available skill courses shall be notified at the beginning of each semester. Skill courses to be offered during the first semester are:

Value Added Courses

Coaching Classes for Entry in Services

There is provision for coaching classes and foundation course for competitive exams for entry in services (both Govt. and Private) for current degree students as well as alumni of the college.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Eligibility

Higher Secondary Arts (Class XI & XII)

A candidate must pass HSLC examination of the Board of Secondary Education, Assam or equivalent examination recognised by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

A candidate must have passed Higher Secondary Examination of AHSEC or equivalent (10+2 Standard) examination recognised by UGC in any stream. Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, s/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations. Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college / department. No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

Admission Procedure

- Admission to Higher Secondary program should be initiated via the [Darpan portal](#) and admission to the Four Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) should be initiated via [Samarth eGov portal](#).
- Admission is done strictly on merit basis, and is governed by the Admission rules of the College. The decision of the Admission Committee in this regard is final.
- Applicants will have to appear in person to confirm their admission through submission of original copies of Pass Certificate, Mark Sheet, Age Certificate, Character Certificate (from the Heads of the institution last attended), Caste Certificate (where necessary) and any other document notified from time to time for college records.

- No application will be accepted after the last date of submission.
- Reservation of seats will be entertained as per Govt. of Assam rules.
- Extra Curricular (EC) quota will be maintained as per Govt. of Assam norms

Fees Structure

The fees structure of different courses will be in adherence to the guidelines of the Govt. of Assam. These structures will be notified in the college notice board and college website.

Documents Required

Candidate Seeking Admission shall have to produce the following documents for recordkeeping :

- One set of photocopies of marksheets duly attested, of qualifying / last attended examination (H.S.L.C./H.S.S.L.C.)
- Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended must be enclosed with the application form.
- Four recent passport size photograph should be pasted on the application form and two photographs are also to be enclosed.
- H.S.L.C. Admit Card (attested coy) must be enclosed with the application form.
- ST/SC/OBC candidates, and those seeking admission in co-curricular quota must enclose relevant certificates.
- Applicants having gap period should produce gap certificate.

Application forms must be completed in all respects. Applicants are directed to keep handy all the original certificates and testimonials for verification and recordkeeping after the admission process.

College Uniform

Kamrup College has a uniform dress code for both boys & girls.

Boys:

Colour- Maroon-black checked shirt & black trousers.

Specifications - Formal shirt & trousers, college logo on the shirt pocket; jeans prohibited.

Girls:

Colour – Maroon-black checked salwar-kameez and black dupatta.

Specifications - Knee length salwar-kameez, college logo on the left sleeve; leggings, churidar and Patiala pants are not allowed.

College Discipline

- Students must come to the college invariably in prescribed uniform. They must bring Identity Card and produce the same when asked for. This rule is considered as minimum in maintaining discipline of the college.
- All the students should read the Notice Board of the College and check the notification section of the college website regularly for updates and notifications.
- Students should be decent, courteous and polite at all times whether they are in the class or in the college premises.
- Students should maintain the beauty and cleanliness of the college and take utmost care to promote the same.
- Scribbling on books, desks and walls is strictly prohibited and liable to fines.
- Spitting, writing and sticking anything on the college walls/rooms are strictly prohibited.
- Students should park their vehicles in the area allotted for the purpose.
- Disobedience and misbehaviour towards staff members or repeated breaking of college rules or behaviour objectionable to the good tone of the school, even outside the college premises will deserve severe punishment or even dismissal if warnings are ignored.
- Students are prohibited to go out of college premises during college hours without the permission of the principal. They are advised to utilize their leisure time in the college library/ common room/ canteen. They will not be allowed to loiter or sit in the veranda.
- Ragging in any form, inside or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited by law. Any student found indulging in ragging will be rusticated from the college.
- Students will not indulge in any anti-social activities or activities causing hindrance to the academic and administrative functioning of the college. Those found indulging in such activities will face disciplinary action to the extent of expulsion from the college.
- During the teaching hours all areas around the classrooms will be observed as Silent zones. The authority will deal with students who create any disturbance, as it deems right. Keep silence when the classes are on.
- Mobile phones are strictly prohibited during class and examination hours. Any violation is subject to severe disciplinary action.
- No student shall intentionally or recklessly disrupt or impede or attempt to disrupt or impede the activities and functions of the college, or any part thereof.

- Irregular attendance, constant negligence of assignments will be severely dealt with. A minimum attendance of 75% is essential for appearing in the council or university examinations. In case of absence due to unavoidable circumstances, prior permission from the appropriate authority has to be taken and endorsed the same handbook. In case of sickness, students will have to produce a Medical Certificate with application from guardian.
- Class-tests, Unit-tests, Assignments and Terminal/Sessional examinations are obligatory on all students. No one should absent herself for an examination/test. If a student is absent for a test or examination a re-test or re-examination will not be given except on medical grounds
- No candidate shall make use of any unfair means in any examination.
- Students' participation and active co-operation in all observation days and other co-curricular activities is must. Students must appreciate the institutional goals and objectives and contribute to their realization by participating in relevant institutional activities.

Disciplinary Procedure

Any complaint by any other member or employee of the college, that a student of the college has committed an offence against the disciplinary regulations is considered by the College's Grievance Redressal Cell, who decides whether a charge shall be brought. If the complaint is of a minor offence, the case may be dealt with by Grievance Redressal Cell, or otherwise it will be forwarded to the jurisdiction of the College Governing Body.
